Women's Fellowship News

Our November meeting had guest speaker Glenis Schreffler sharing about the Backpack Program sponsored by the First United Methodist Church with eight churches from the area assisting. Glenis chairs this tremendous outreach to children from all schools in The Dalles that are in need of food during their weekends while away from their school breakfast and lunch programs. Over 150 food bags are given out weekly to these children and their families in need. The food chosen is mostly non-perishable and that which can be consumed with little preparation. It is an amazing outreach. Donations area always welcomed and needed. A list of preferred food is available in our church office. Monetary funds can be given by writing a check to the payee: First United Methodist Church and the FOR indicating "The Backpack program". We thank Glenis for her amazing outreach and perpetual commitment to this program. She says that it is spiritually driven and a generous God that provides the power behind the program which is amazing, including the prayers and volunteers and all that is donated.

At our business meeting, it was voted on that eight \$25 gift cards will be given to the Backpack program to help where needed. We also designated a \$100 check to the Department of Human Services. This money is used towards children in need of Christmas cheer.

Lots of activities abound in December. We have the Church Bazaar, our annual Soup and Bread Luncheon and the Foster Children's Christmas Party as our events which need active participation. The Church Bazaar is on December 9th right after church. All of us attending church participate in the Bazaar. Bring your food goods, your homemade crafts, and other appropriate items the morning of the Bazaar, right before church. As soon as church is over the Bazaar will begin. Your contributions strengthen Women's Fellowship outreach to others. Monday, December 10th, is the date for our annual December Soup and Bread Luncheon that begins at NOON. All women of the church are welcome to attend.

Soup is being brought by Caroline Homer, Jean Vercouteren, and Rymmel Lovell. Yvonne Hartung and Joy Krein are the Hostesses. They will set up the event and provide the dessert. Rosemary Ross will provide the Devotional. Sue Wilson will organize our annual card signing sent to members and friends no longer able to attend church. We also will have guest speaker Jenny Loughmiller sharing her Hundred Hearts Project and her focus on Gratitude.

On Wednesday, December 12th, many members help with the Foster Children's Christmas Party which is from 2 to 4. This is a church sponsored event. Gifts, for the Gift Shoppe, are supplied by all of us attending church. The gifts are for the parents attending the party and given to them by their children who have shopped in the Gift Shoppe during the party. We are still in need of Gifts for men; jewelry and scarves for women and socks, hats and gloves for men and women.

The Christmas Bazaar Coupon

On the Bazaar tables you might see "Christmas Bazaar Coupons." These coupons are offering you an item to buy. Something you don't want right away...maybe a month or two from now. Many items could be offered, like pies, cinnamon rolls, cobblers, even a dinner for 4... who knows! Look for them! The seller will list what they are selling; the price of the item and their name. The potential buyer sees the coupon, what is being sold and by whom and the price. The potential buyer decides to buy the coupon...how...by picking it up and taking it to the cashier with the money it takes to buy it. The cashier cuts the coupon and gives the buyer the bottom half. The top half goes to the seller. The seller either calls or meets with the buyer. Arrangements are made as to when the buyer will receive the purchased item!! For example: The seller has a coupon for an apple pie for \$8.

The potential buyer sees that coupon and wants the Apple Pie but not now...maybe in January. The buyer picks up the coupon and takes it to the cashier with the \$8 owed. The cashier takes the money, cuts the coupon and saves the top half for the seller and gives the bottom half to the buyer. Soon after the seller meets with the buyer at the Bazaar...or goes home and calls the buyer to make arrangements for the Apple Pie to be delivered. The buyer says to the seller, "I would like the Apple Pie delivered on January 20th." So, on January 20th the buyer receives an Apple Pie from the seller!! Yum!! (P.S. Any one of us can be the seller or buyer...have fun participating!!)

Wiley Memorial Crèche

The Irving Nathaniel Wiley Memorial Crèche will be on display the first Sunday in December through Epiphany. The seventy-year old Crèche was given in memory of Mr. Wiley by his family during the Christmas season after his passing from a sudden heart attack on April 4, 1948. Christmas was a special time for him and his family as he was born on Christmas Day 1892. He was a member of this church from 1924-1948; but at that time, it was known as the First Congregational Church.

While living in The Dalles, he had been a teacher, principal and assistant coach at The Dalles High School as well as serving as a Sunday School teacher at our church. He and his wife Margie had six children, now all deceased. His living family members from this church are his daughter-in-law Dorothy Wiley, and his grandchildren, Joy Krein and Doug Hattenhauer and their spouses. Plus, many other grandchildren, great grandchildren and great, great grandchildren from The Dalles, other towns in Oregon and throughout the Northwest, Iowa and Washington, D.C.
